### HISTORY

Durwood District Co-op., began from very humble beginnings, back in 1962 in a small back room at St. Scholastica's Church after Mass on Sunday mornings the Bennettswood Co-op. Credit Soc., was born. In 1968 Durwood & District Credit Co-op. was born in a similar way.

Its registered office was 44 Douglas Street, Ashwood. This continued for a number of years until July, 1972, when an amalgamation of two offices took place. An office was opened at East Burwood (at Middleborough Road and Burwood Highway). Then in 1973 an office was opened upstairs on the corner of Toorak and Warrigal Roads. These two offices were open for Members enquiries and transactions from Mondays to Saturdays inclusive.

During 1980 Burwood District Co-op., has purchased and renovated the building which was "Tait's" old corner and have grown into the enterprise that you see today.

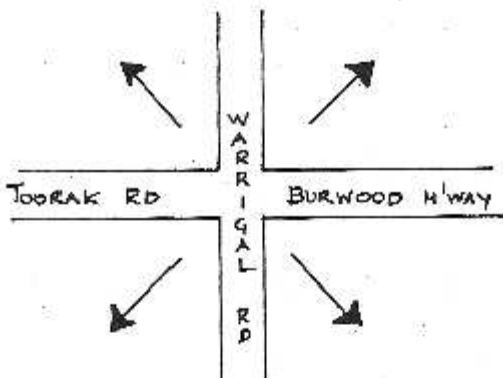

## BURWOOD COMMUNITY EDUCATION CENTRE

A new program of day and evening courses will begin at this Centre, located at Burwood State College, Burwood Highway, from February 9.

Craft courses for adults and teenagers include :

- Pottery, Basketry, Lead-lighting, Macrame
- Patchwork, Crochet, Florentine Embroidery
- Painting & Drawing and Creative Stitchery.

For those who want to tone up their bodies, various classes are available :

- Keep-fit, Jazz Ballet, Creative Dance & Yoga.

Other popular courses are :

- Folk-Guitar, Chinese Cooking, Skin Care & Make-up, Gardening, Helping your Child with Maths, and Parent Effectiveness Training, (commonly known as P.E.T.).

# Editorial

Our "Guinea-Pig" Edition proved the point that Burwood residents need a "voice" and we thank all who wrote, phoned or personally gave us their support or financial assistance so that we may continue our Community Newsletter. Special thanks to the "Eastern Standard" newspaper for their generous publicity (photo & article 11/2/81).

Within 24 hours of our first issue the Editor received a phone-call from a Director of Burwood District Credit Co-operative Ltd, offering substantial support to the BURWOOD BULLETIN - a community service. We are extremely grateful to have such a generous sponsor.

Waverley City Council has given us a grant also, as we go to press, and we are further encouraged. We feel the efforts made by our volunteer team, all busy people in this community, are more than compensated by such practical expressions of support.

Two of our team (Editor and Co-ordinator) were invited to join the Management Committee of Burwood Community Education Centre and were duly elected in December, as Community Representatives. This is very rewarding as we have a most cordial relationship with BRCEC and work in close co-operation with their staff and Committee.

We have been contacting Burwood traders and services and their response was most enthusiastic - both verbally and financially, where able. It is most gratifying to report that moneys raised in this "door-knock" campaign in our main shopping area, plus the abovementioned grants, have enabled us to double our circulation, in this issue.

During our visits to local stores and services we made many friends and learnt a great deal about their problems. Some traders suffered unexpected losses over Christmas, others offered us advertisements hoping to "turn the tide". Several, unhappily, were having to leave Burwood and, in one case, another had to retrench a staff-member, due to business difficulties.

We learnt that in many instances Burwood stores cannot rely on Burwood patronage in order to stay in business. They must advertise elsewhere to draw customers from other areas!

If we are to retain the wide range of services set up in Burwood for our divers needs we must shop locally to keep the shops open. Perhaps there is need for a Burwood Traders' Association?

The advent of the East Burwood tram extension was a blow to our local traders as many tram-commuters now by-pass Burwood.

Our advertisers and sponsors in this issue readily supported BURWOOD BULLETIN. May we count on our readers to look again at what they offer and join us in saying -

## OUTREACH YOUTH WORKER APPOINTED FOR BOX HILL/BURWOOD



"Outreach is being prepared to listen, any hour and anywhere", according to Wayne Wright, 28, who has just begun working in our area with the YMCA Outreach Project. This Project is being funded jointly by Bennettswood Lions Club and Box Hill Council (as we reported in STOP PRESS, last issue).

Wayne comes to Box Hill with experience gained from working with young people in Canada as well as Australia.

He sees outreach work as a new approach to supporting teenagers and providing some adult company that is often missing in their lives.

He aims to be a link between young people and the community, and to work with existing youth services to develop programs to meet local needs and interests.

"Outreach is a complete reversal of roles with the youth worker going out and reaching the kids" Wayne says.

Bennettswood Lions Club spokesman Mr Mike Trucman said "Lions are initiators. We hope this project will be shown to be worthwhile and that another organization may be interested in taking it over at the end of the 12 months".

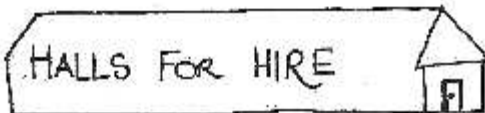

# YOUTH ACTIVITIES

## BURWOOD YOUTH AND FRIDAY NIGHTS

"There's nothing to do ...."

Do you confront a statement like that as often as I do? Parents and teenagers alike use this as an excuse for the high incidence of teenage delinquency and alcoholism in the Burwood area, particularly Friday and Saturday nights. Unfortunately, I feel that to a large extent they are right. This may result in your son or daughter taking part in a drunken binge and leaving themselves open to physical harm. Do you really know where your son or daughter goes on Friday nights and what they do?

There are some organized activities for youth on Fridays. One of them, the teenage social dancing class at St Benedict's Youth & Recreation Centre, has been running continuously now for over four and a half years. The class teaches young people from Year 8 upwards, not just the rudiments of ballroom, disco and rock-and-roll dancing, but also encourages the social aspects of meeting and caring for others and making friends. At the height of its popularity teenagers numbered between 60 and 70 every night, with new, and usually shy beginners starting every week. All the beginners are looked after by one of the dance teachers for the first two weeks and taught the basics, during which they've usually made friends with some of the more experienced teenage dancers.

For those teenagers who discover they actually enjoy the "old fogey" ballroom dancing there are medal classes before the social class, where they can learn how to dance well.

So next time someone says to you "there's nothing to do ..." you now know that this is not entirely correct.
