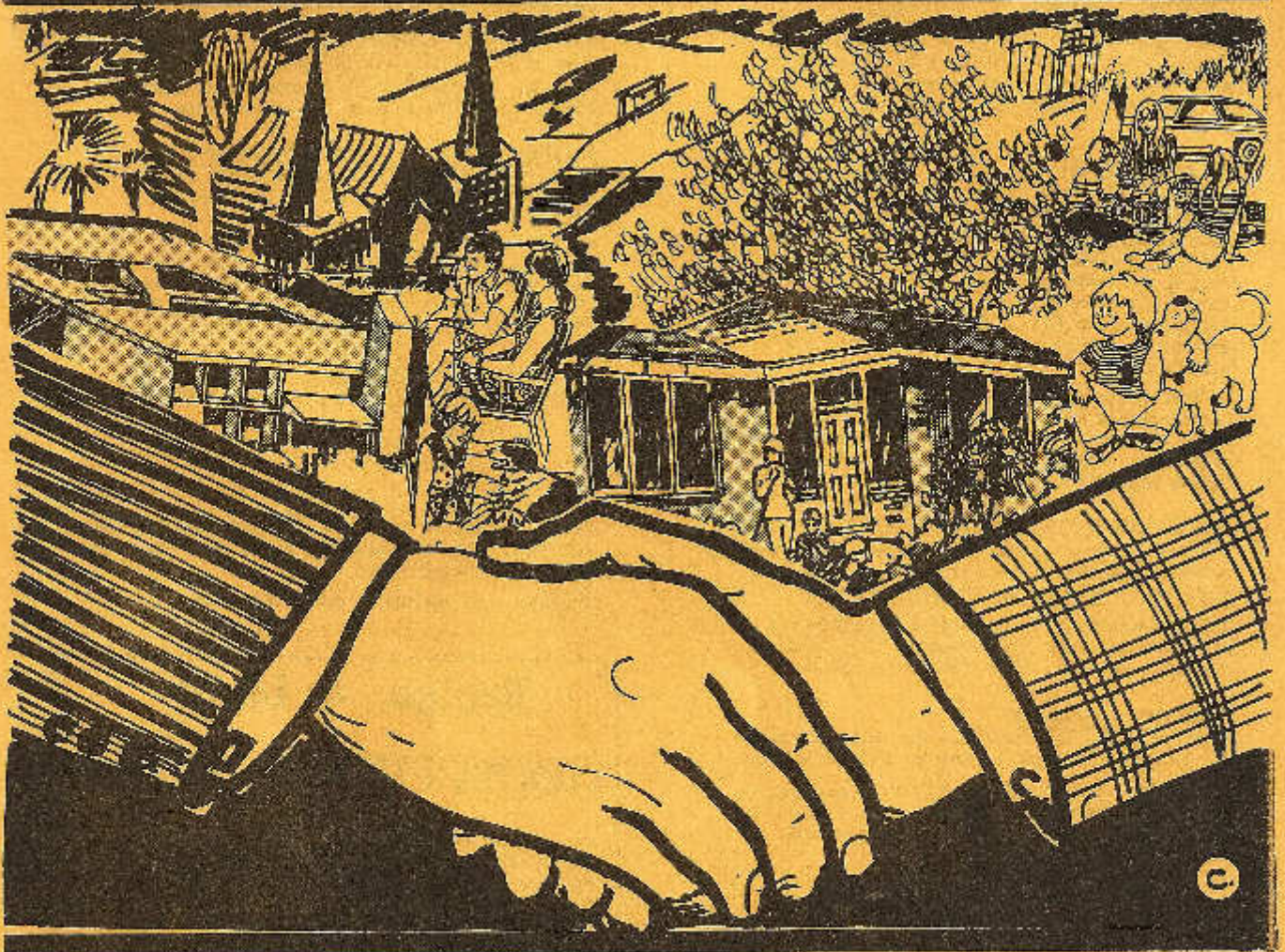

# Editorial

Another milestone has been reached - 5,000 copies, an increase of 2,000. We have contacted dozens of organizations within our area of distribution and the result is within these covers. We want to keep in touch with ALL community groups serving the Burwood district, receiving reports of activities and advance publicity for fund-raising or other functions seeking public support. Membership of several groups has already increased due to such publicity.

In Issue 3 we have focused on our three local Councils of Box Hill, Camberwell and Maberley. As Burwood rate-payers, we must look to them for such services as Citizens' Advice Bureaux, Meals-on-Wheels, Youth Workers, and Home Help - in fact, local welfare for all ages.

We appreciate the co-operation of all three in supplying suitable publications for our research. The wide range of services provided by Councils covers so many areas of need in today's high pressure life-styles for families, or loneliness of "singles or solos" and newcomers such as migrants and refugees within our community. There is something for everyone - just phone your Citizens' Advice Bureau. (See lists under Council headings). These Bureaux are manned by both trained Social Workers and volunteers and they are expert at problem-solving be it welfare, personal, or perhaps a choice of craft or another course.

Community Centres are provided by all Councils and these may be used as "drop-in centres" for a cup of coffee and a chat, or for counselling on some personal problem, or participation in an educational or hobby class to interest you.

With more people planning early retirement or shorter working weeks, facilities for leisure and pleasure as provided by Councils and clubs will be in greater demand. In Box Hill alone we found organizations listed as diverse as Fencing, Marching Girls, Archery and Parents of Twins Clubs!

Councils can only provide many services with the aid of volunteers and, through such participation, friendships are formed, loneliness disappears, and a new sense of purpose is achieved. Handymen and women are always in demand by our senior and disabled citizens; mini-buses need drivers for transport of disadvantaged groups; Meals-on-Wheels must be manned, migrants need English tutors, unemployed need to learn new skills. Our job is not finished when we leave the work-force - we all need each other to build a good and stable society in this Burwood area we call home.

## COMPLAINTS ABOUT "R" FILMS AT DRIVE-IN

A local newspaper printed news of objections to the screening of "R" classified films at Burwood Drive-In, based on the fact that these films are visible not only to the theatre patrons but also to under-age members of nearby households.

The Member for Bennettswood, Keith McCance, M.L.A. followed up these objections by writing to the Attorney-General, The Hon. R. Storey. In reply, while not proposing any changes, Mr. Storey noted that "... the cinema industry has adopted a code of self-regulation, committing exhibitors to, among other things screening sexually explicit "R" classified films later in the night and at theatres which have not previously been the subject of complaint."

Individual complaints, if any breach is detected, should be addressed directly to the exhibitor concerned, or to the Cinematograph Exhibitors' Association. Mr. McCance has offered to present signed petitions sent to him by local residents at the Spring Session of Parliament.

## UNEMPLOYMENT

### CONCERN FOR THE UNEMPLOYED - CAN YOU HELP?

**BURWOOD UNEMPLOYMENT ACTION GROUP** (a group of local people concerned about the ever-increasing problem of unemployment).

- \* Who are the unemployed?  
Of the 422,800 Australians looking for work in February, 1981, more than 30% were 15-19.
- \* How long are they unemployed?  
The average time is now 28.7 weeks.
- \* What do the unemployed live on?  
A couple with three children receive \$136.80 per week unemployment benefit - \$21.20 under the poverty line of \$158.  
A single parent with three children receives \$94.10 per week - \$25.90 under the poverty line of \$120.00

We believe the Unemployment Benefit to be totally inadequate and becoming increasingly so, as these Benefits are not keeping pace with inflation.

The under-18 benefit has remained at \$36 per week since 1976.

Though there appears to be no immediate solution to the problem of unemployment, we also believe that the unemployed should at least be able to live with dignity.

If you agree, why not write to your Federal Member of Parliament, expressing your concern, and urging the immediate raising of the benefits to at least the poverty line.

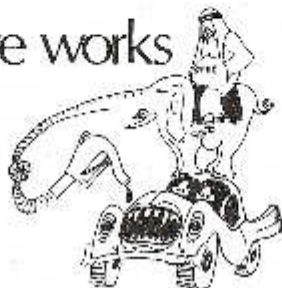

HOW THE MAIL CAME THROUGH IN HORSE AND BUGGY DAYS

In response to the invitation in the last issue for local history notes, John McNeill, Postmaster at Burwood, has supplied the following letter from the archives, giving information about the beginning of postal services in the district and how the mail got through.

Post 1864

"A Post Office was first established at what is now Burwood in the year 1863. In those days the district was known as Ballyshanassy, and the first Postmaster was Terence O'Reilly.

In 1879 the name of the district and Post Office was changed to Burwood. The Postmaster of the day was W. F. Clarke and he received £21 per annum.

It is interesting to note that a wagon mail service which was commenced in 1865 operated twice-daily between Ballyshanassy and Melbourne via Hawthorn and Richmond.

Other local mail services about that time were between Hawthorn and Kew and between Kew and Ballyshanassy by way of Hartwell. This latter service operated three times a week and was done on horse-back.

Burwood Post Office attained official status on 1 September, 1943, and was situated at the corner of Toorak Road and Myrning Street, in the premises now occupied by E. Flintoff & Sons. The present Post Office at 1414 Toorak Road was constructed in 1957/8 and was opened by Senator Hannan on March 17, 1958."

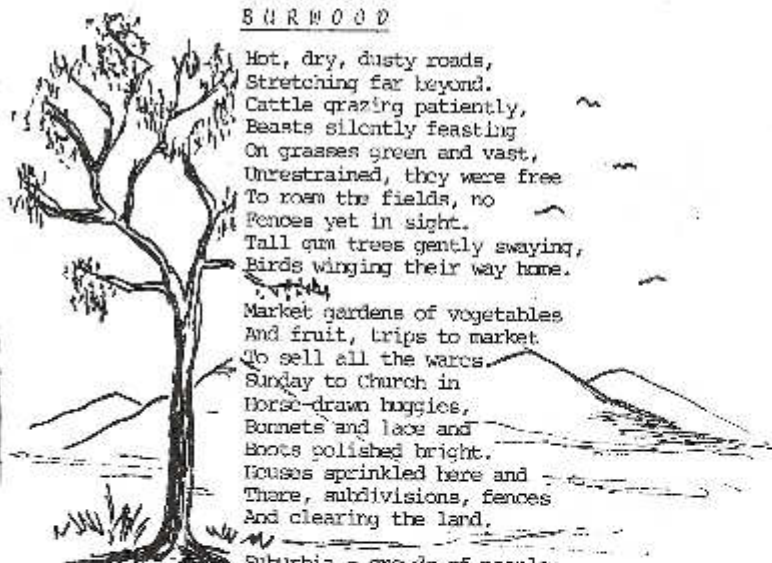

## Council Services

### BOX HILL LOCAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE

A serious effort by the Box Hill Council to establish effective two-way channels of communication with groups and residents on community welfare matters, and to promote the greatest possible caring co-operation has resulted in the proposed formation of a Local Advisory Committee on community welfare.

An invitation to community groups to nominate a representative to a 20-member committee was issued in May, with 30 June as the target date for the Committee to take shape and begin its work.

With each of the twenty neighbourhoods in Box Hill represented by a member of the Advisory Committee, it is also hoped that each representative will be supported by a small "neighbourhood team".

### WHAT IS CAMCARE?

CAMCARE is the Camberwell Counselling and Care Service which was set up to assist the people of Camberwell and surrounding areas. It is a Citizens' Advice Bureau staffed by trained welfare volunteers and backed by professional social workers, with offices at Camberwell and Ashburton.
