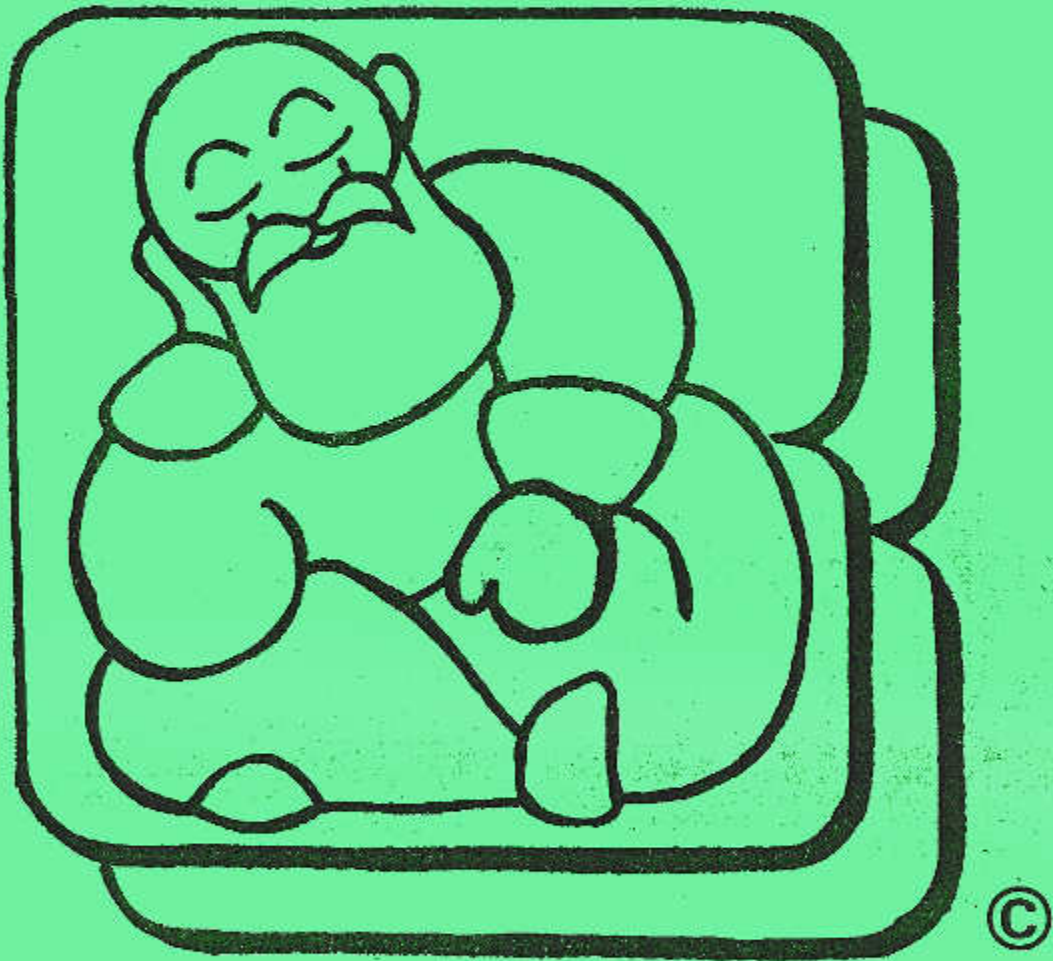

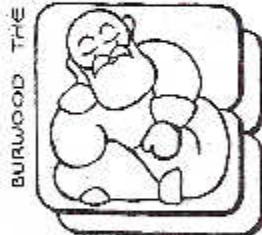

BOX HILL COUNCIL has initiated a program throughout the City, whereby residents will be encouraged to promote a spirit of friend-ship and support within each street, neigh-bour to neighbour, whilst respecting the privacy of all individuals and families.

Street volunteers will be calling personally on their neighbours to increase each fam-ily's access to information about services available in the community.

With the proliferation of cars in most driveways, women working outside the home and the commuting of many workers, many of us do not meet our neighbours, and this new community project should be welcomed.

Twenty neighbourhoods will be designated in Box Hill and from each a representative will be nominated to a central welfare ad-visory committee.

Many Burwood residents will be receiving a copy of each issue of BURWOOD BULLETIN from their Street Representatives on the newly-formed "Burwood Neighbourhood Group 'P' Committee". They will be caring people, interested in others welfare.

We salute Box Hill Council as they launch this concerned and caring initiative and trust that it may spill over into other areas so that no-one need feel lonely nor neglected in this age of "nuclear-families".

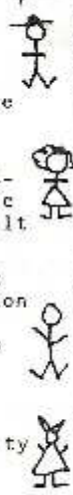
PUBLIC MEETING - NEIGHBOURHOOD HOUSE

CITY OF WAVERLEY PLANS FOR WARRIGAL ROAD

Waverley Council will go ahead with building a low income village for the aged in Warrigal Road, Burwood.
 The village will include self-contained units, a hostel for the frail, a nursing home and a community centre that will contain a day care centre, the Council has decided.
 Waverley councillors gave the okay for the proposal at a special meeting in July. The council will begin negotiations to buy the land, situated in Warrigal Road, Burwood, which is presently owned by the Board of Works.
 Part of the proposed site is owned by the Housing Commission and the council will confirm the verbal offer to lease its section to the council for \$7600 a year. The council has also advised the Housing Minister that it had sufficient land to build 30 low income elderly persons units. The council plan to build 10 one-bedroom units and 20 two-bedroom units. Another 30 units are planned at a later stage for subsidised private accommodation for those who can afford to pay.
 The planned units would cater for people who can afford more than Housing Commission accommodation but cannot afford the \$50,000 to \$60,000 now being charged for life-term tenancy at private elderly accommodation villages. The hostel will care for people who cannot care for themselves. The community hall would be a recreation centre for village residents as well as providing day-care services for other people in the community such as disabled or people crippled by a stroke or arthritis.

GAFFNEY HOUSE PROGRESS

In Gaffney House, Lynden Street, Burwood the City of Camberwell will offer motel-type units, including bed-sitting room and shower/toilet facilities for eligible elderly Camberwell residents.

"Every effort is being made to provide a home-like rather than institutional atmosphere" said a spokesperson for the Council. "Residents will be well looked after, with meals provided in a communal dining-room. Emergency buttons are being installed which will be connected directly with the Supervisor's unit and with an outside emergency light."

Progress with building, furnishing and landscaping is well-advanced and it is expected that the units will be opened in November. A Supervisor has been appointed and has been in residence since October.

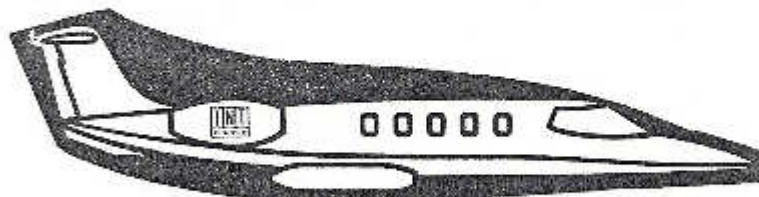

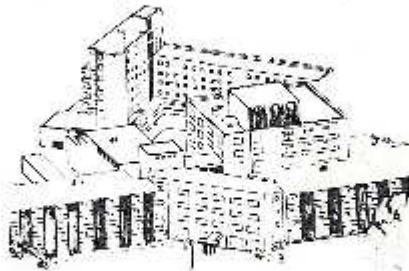

BURWOOD POLICE STATION

Although the Burwood Police Station is not a 24-hour station, the area is serviced by the Box Hill Police Station which opens 24 hours. The Traffic Operations Squad in Nunawading can also help out in an urgent situation.

Senior Sergeant Flannigan, Officer-in-Charge of Burwood Police, advises anyone needing urgent assistance at night to phone 024 (667 1911) or dial 000.

"Our station is manned from 8 a.m. - 5 p.m. (Monday-Saturday) and from 2 a.m. - 5 p.m. (Sunday)" he said. They always try to have an afternoon shift, which is from 4 p.m. - midnight every Thursday, Friday and Saturday, as well as the ordinary day-shift.

Working with Sen Sgt Flannigan are two Sergeants and five police officers. For the use of the Box Hill Station for Burwood residents the Burwood Station contributes by having one officer work one night a fortnight at Box Hill Police Station.

NEWS FROM BURWOOD COMMUNITY EDUCATION CENTRE (B.R.C.E.C.)

This year we have been lucky enough to acquire a full-time in-service Education Officer, Neil Black, who organizes programs to meet the needs not just of teachers, but of parents as well. Generally these programs are funded by the Education Dept. and are therefore frequently free of charge. For more information about these programs, phone Neil on 285 0415.

Two groups moved into our premises in 1981, namely the Health Resource Centre and Theatre Works.

The Health Resource Centre provides services for people interested in Health Education, such as teachers, parents, nurses, doctors, librarians and community educators. Theatre Works is the Eastern Suburbs Community Theatre Company and present performances throughout our area, e.g. in schools and institutions. TOC H - THE QUILT HELPERS



TOC H is a Christian-based voluntary movement with membership open to men and women who are trying, through the corporate life of a TOC H branch and in their personal lives, to build a caring community.

TOC H has shown that ordinary people can offer extraordinary services, including pioneering work for the Blood Transfusion Service, emergency alarm systems for the sick and elderly, and, more recently, discos for the handicapped. TOC H members, in their own quiet way also continue to provide compassionate help at a personal level to those who are ill or handicapped, in hospital or out of prison.

TOC H is about people helping other people.

How it began. In 1915 an Army Chaplain, "Tubby" Clayton, started a rest and recreation centre in a Belgian war-zone. This centre, called Talbot House, was soon shorted by the troops to TOC H and it became the starting-point for a world-wide movement still active nearly seventy years later, with 12,000 members in 950 groups in Britain, Australia and fourteen other countries.

It is expected that various municipal committees will probably be continuing into 1982.

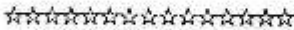

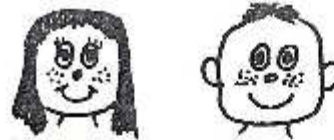

Programs are usually held two weeks prior to the Australia Day long week-end in January, and also during the May and August/September holidays.

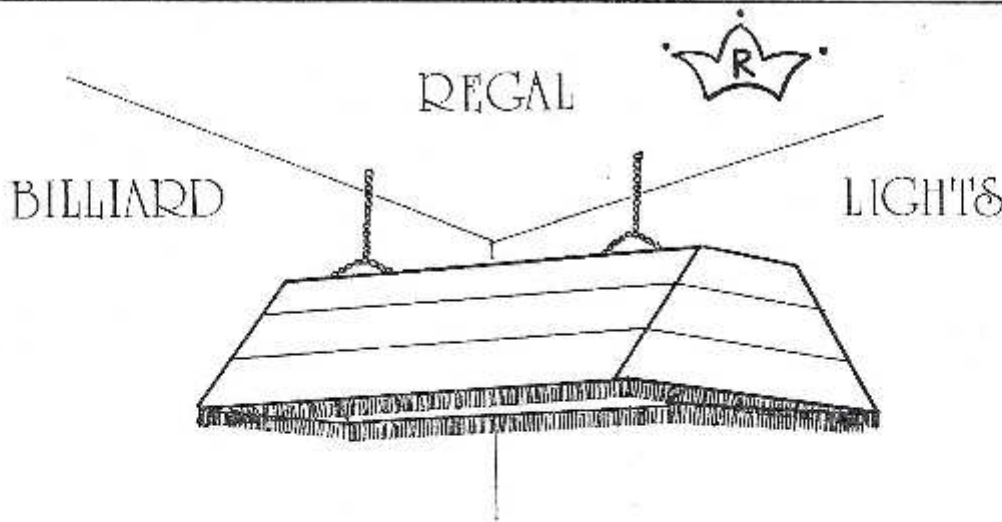

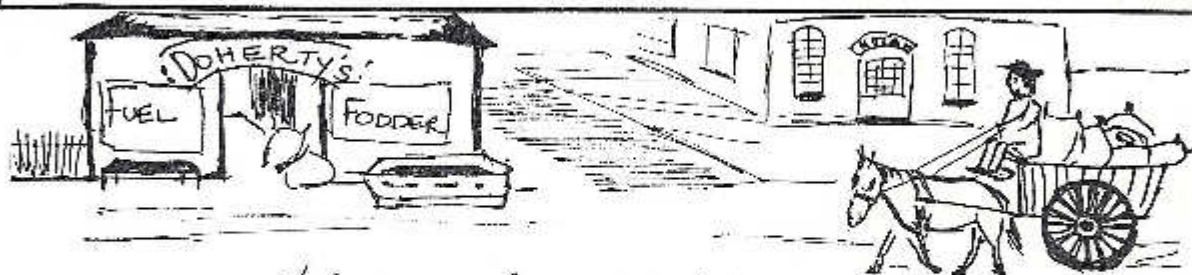

HISTORY PAGE



Dohertys see changes and challenges...

To many people in the Burwood area, J. W. DOHERTY & SONS has 'always been there'. Well, since 1926, anyway. That's when John Werner Doherty set up his Fuel & Fodder business - first at 108 Through Road, then just along Warrigal Road from the Toorak Road/Burwood Highway intersection.

John started the business with his four sons Stan, Hughie, Alec (dec.) and Bill. Hughie was 14 at the time and still attending school. "I used to leave school at 4 p.m., go to Burwood and drive a horse-drawn dray to do the deliveries," he recalls. Those were the years of the Great Depression.

Present site

In 1929 John Doherty bought the present site with a shed on it, from Ray Lambeth, local real estate agent... and amateur magician! On the corner of the Highway was a hay and corn store called Hill and Dalton. A hotel on the opposite corner eventually ran down and was demolished. The trams only ran as far as Alfred Road.

Further down Toorak Road Hughie remembers "a chap called Alshett owned a Zoo where he kept monkeys plus kangaroos, emus and other Australian native animals, and plenty of birds in a huge aviary". Mr Alshett had a creek running through his property which he dug out and created a billabong.

Market-gardens and cattle-farming

Adjacent was Mr Hill who owned a cauliflower garden which stretched from Toorak Road to Oxford Street, almost one kilometre. At the time the area was all market-gardens and cattle-farming.

The Dohertys began with a cattle-farm in Through Road and also made icecream to sell to the local cricketers. Although their mother, Lillian, was a good businesswoman, the farm business tapered out with more and more people moving into the area.

Misfortune hits family

The family was struck by misfortune in 1936 when John Doherty broke his back. Hughie explained that his father was helping a family shift from their home during the floods and when the truck became bogged he crawled underneath to place a jack which disappeared into the mud and he was pinned down. He spent twelve months in bed and didn't work very much after that. John dies in 1960 aged 69.

After the War

Hughie and his three brothers left the business during the Second World War and when they returned both Bill and Alec decided to take a soldier-settlement lot. Stan and Hughie rejoined the business. Because of the food shortage caused by the war the Dohertys began an ice-trade as a means of storing food until ice-chests were replaced by refrigerators. Solid fuel, such as wood was everyone's source of heating and cooking. When oil and gas came on the market the firewood supply business started to diminish and almost stopped.

Diversification

The family looked for anything hard to purchase in conventional stores, to trade in. These items included wire, barbed-wire, cement, sand, earth and mixed soil. "Plastic brought new changes to the industry" and, Hughie philosophies, "changes bring a new challenge."

Retirement

Hughie retired from the business in 1970 and toured Australia with his wife. Stan retired in 1977 and now Ian McKay, who started working at the store after school, runs the business. Hughie enjoys helping out on the occasional Saturday morning as "it's good for the ego".

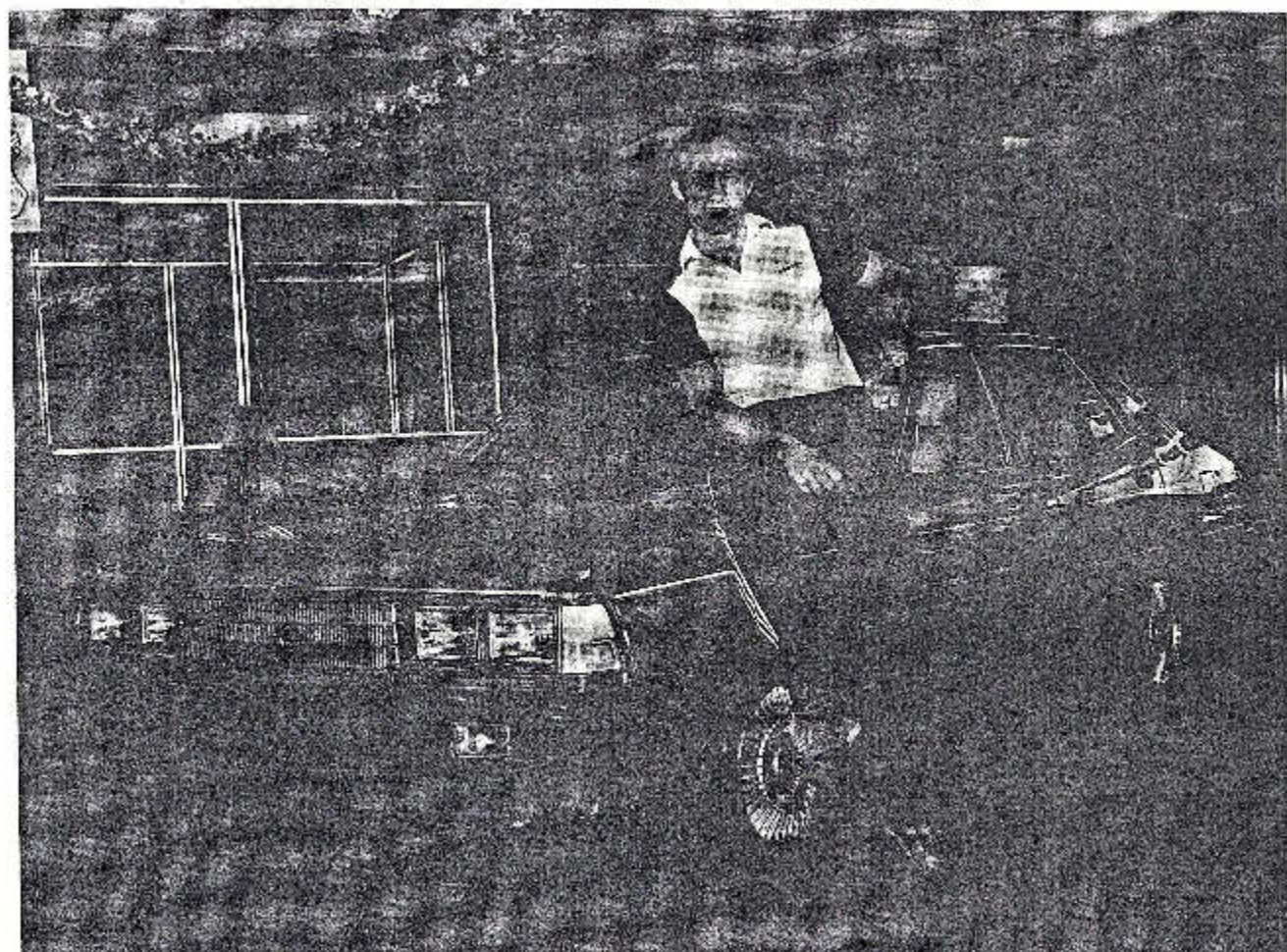
