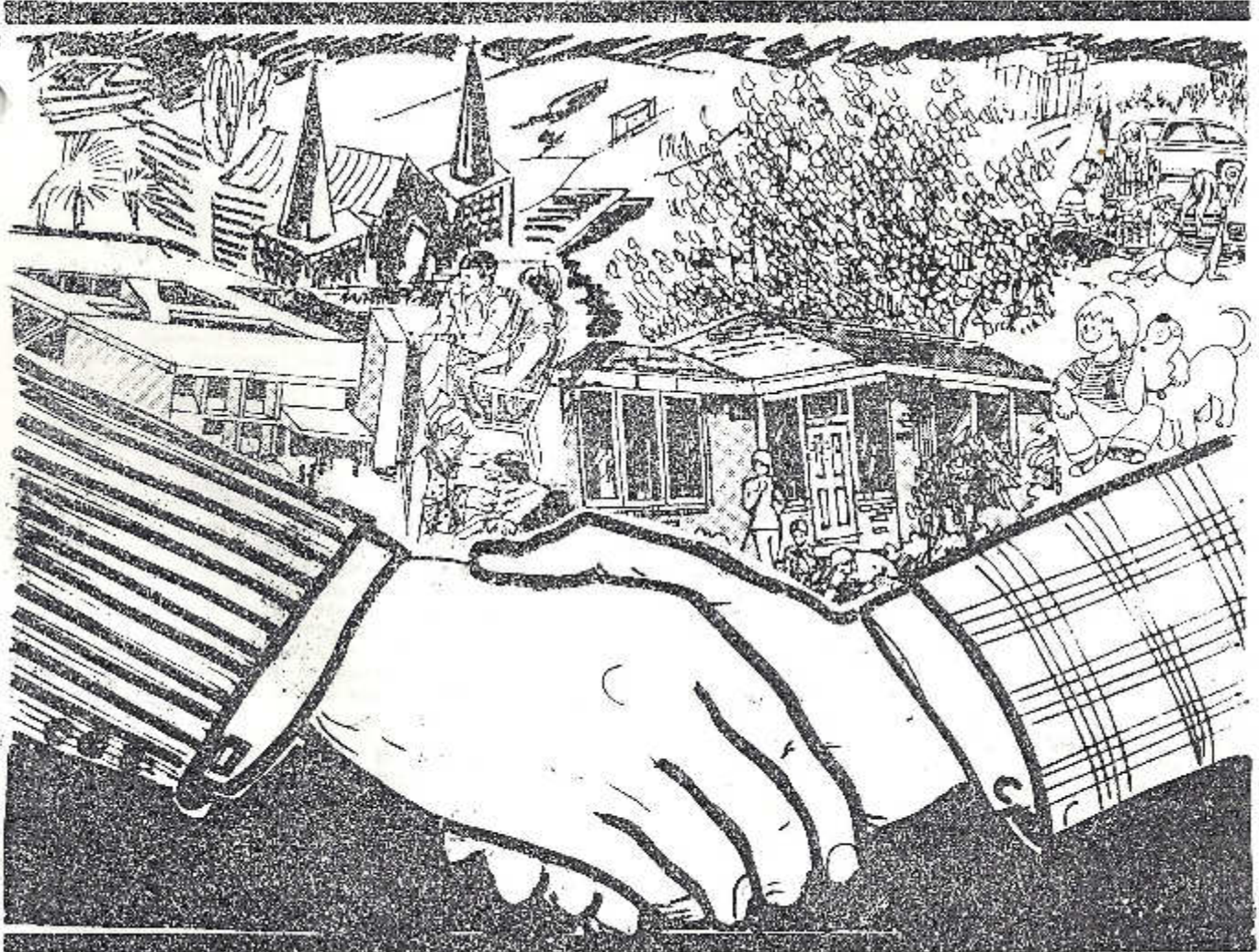

At our Planning Meeting we were privileged to be addressed by Box Hill Community & Recreation Officer (Mr. Ron Johnson) and the Chairman of the Burwood Regional Community Educational Centre (B.R.C.E.C.) Mr. David Burns, who is also a Lecturer at Burwood State College. They outlined the facilities offered by each body for community groups and residents. This culminated in a grant of \$100 from Box Hill Council (plus Mr. Johnson's continued guidance); \$20 from B.R.C.E.C., and \$20 from the Evening Fellowship, Burwood Uniting Church, to assist with printing costs. B.R.C.E.C. also offered use of their electric typewriters and offset printing services at Burwood State College, at low cost, and we provided the volunteers.

We are most grateful to these bodies for their interest and support.
