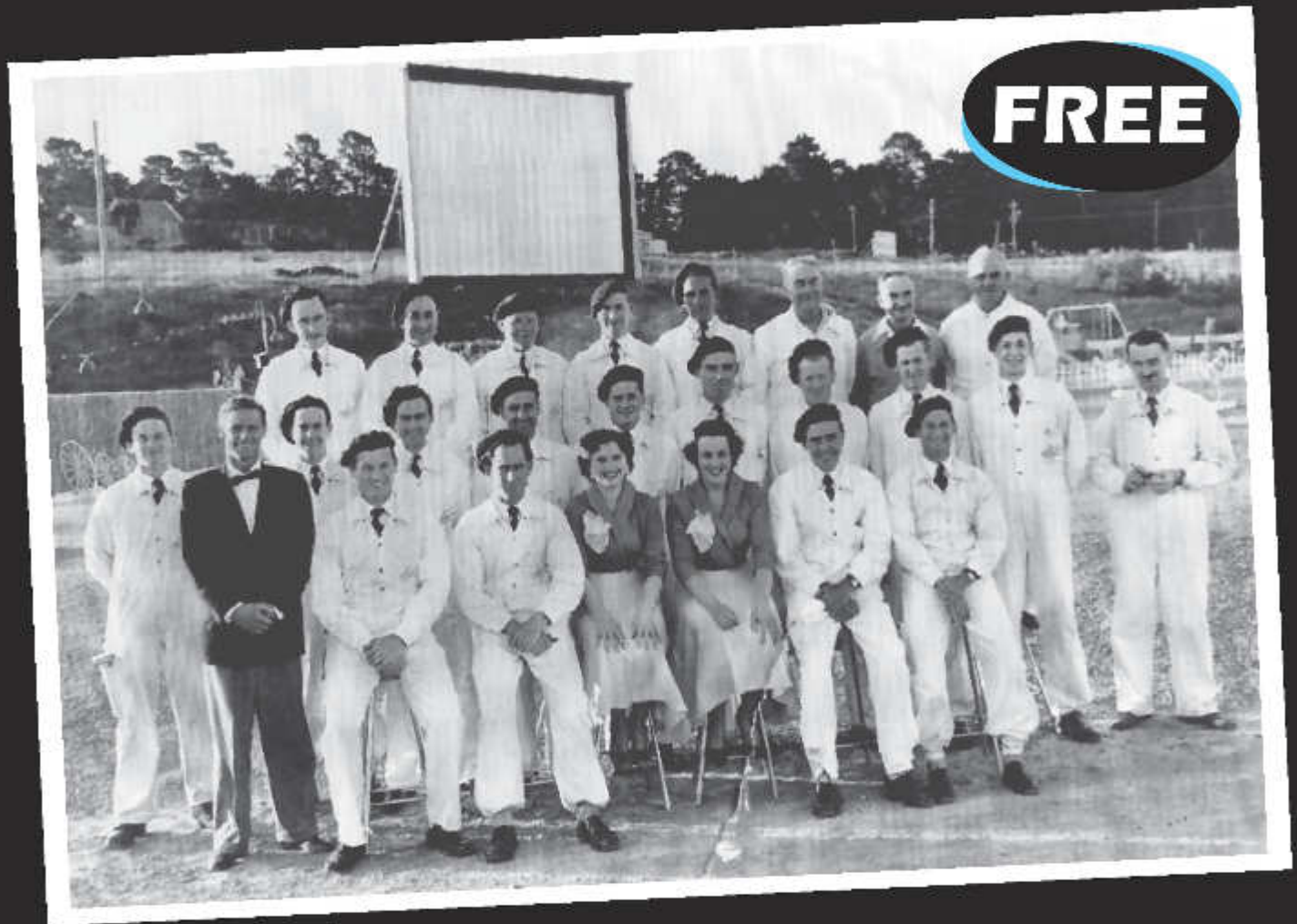

Stars under the Stars

As the first-ever drive-in built in Australia, the Burwood drive-in is historically significant. It opened to the public on February 18, 1954, as the 'Burwood Skyline', after a preview screening to an invited audience of *The Conquest of Everest* the night before. The opening film was *On the Riviera*, starring Danny Kaye and Gene Tieney.

The Burwood Skyline's entrance was located in McComas Grove, a small side street which remained blocked for hours, not just on the first night but for years afterwards. The exit was on Burwood Road, which is now called the Burwood Highway. The Skyline could accommodate 652 cars, and there were two film sessions every night.

The drive-in site nestled in a natural amphitheatre in a valley which covered 10 acres. The screen was located on a steep rise on the western side of Gardiner's Creek. Facilities for families were a high priority. There was a playground in front of the screen (on the opposite side of Gardiner's Creek). In the centre, a simple rectangular shed-like building was the 'diner' (snack bar).

The cost of entry was 4 shillings for adults, and on Saturdays it was a shilling extra. Children were admitted for one shilling. 'Car-hops', the equivalent of ushers, not only sold tickets in the driveway, they also directed cars on the ramps and performed general security duties.

Around 18 months after opening, the Burwood Skyline expanded to accommodate more cars. The screen was extended to widen it to cinemascope width. A cream-brick sided 'walk-in' was built for those without vehicles and a motor-driven merry-go-round was a thrilling addition to the playground. A western-themed BBQ area decorated with cacti and wagon wheels became a feature of the drive-in at this time.

Popular films in 1950s and 1960s included *Some Like It Hot* with Marilyn Monroe, *James Bond*, *The Sound of Music* and of course, Westerns. The name Skyline disappeared in the mid-60s and Burwood, along with the other Skyline theatres in Victoria, was simply renamed as a Hoyts drive-in.

Alun Evans, who now lives in Cardiff, Wales, worked at the Burwood drive-in when he lived in Melbourne. He writes: *"For ten years from the mid '70s to the early '80s, I worked for Hoyts Theatres as a Theatre Manager. During that time, I was the Manager of the Malvern Cinema and later, the Bentleigh Cinema. I then moved to be the holiday relief Manager for the drive-in theatre circuit. I regularly managed the Burwood drive-in theatre. There was a photograph on the wall in the Manager's office showing the crowd on the night the drive-in opened. There were literally hundreds of cars, a number of trucks, and at least one horse and cart.*

"The drive-in was also hired out for other purposes, and at Burwood there were regular Sunday afternoon church services with the Minister standing on the back of a tray [sic] body truck and the congregation sitting in their cars, listening to the service through the speaker hanging on the car window.

"The Burwood drive-in was on a very attractive site and even had an artificial lake with a purpose-built 'Steak house' in the middle. By the time I worked there, the Steak house was no longer in use, as people preferred the fast food available at the Snack bar.

"The drive-in was surrounded by houses, and there were often complaints of noise, especially as hundreds of cars left the theatre late at night. Our solution was to run speakers into the houses that backed onto the drive-in, so that these people could watch the movies free of charge. It was much more difficult to complain about the noise if you were receiving something for nothing.

"On busy nights, the drive-in would be staffed by a manager, a ticket seller, five or six car-hops, two operators (projectionists), and five or six people in the snack bar. We could get 700 to 800 cars into the drive-in, and then spend just as long trying to clear the streets of the hundreds of cars which could not get in because we were full.

"There were always stories of people sneaking into the drive-in, under blankets, in panel vans, or even in the boots of cars. I know some people got away with it, but it became a matter of pride for the drive-in staff to catch the offenders.

"With the introduction of black and white television, and later colour television, and with the increase in other entertainment options, drive-ins began to lose their popularity. Audience numbers continued to fall, especially in the winter months. In the end, the land value of the drive-ins outweighed the value of the ticket sales and they began to be sold for housing and industrial development."

After 29 years, with around 100 cars in to see *We of the Never-never*, plus *Local Hero*, the Burwood drive-in closed its gates for the last time on Wednesday 22 June, 1983. The site became an electricity supply depot and is now occupied by Alinta. The diner and car ramps were replaced by large industrial buildings and yards. The entry area was divided off and has become a small park, where the ticket box serves as a barbecue shelter. Within the fenced-off electricity company grounds, the ornamental lake still exists with the Steak house used as a lunch room. The indoor viewing room was converted into a maintenance shed, while the BBQ area has survived.

The Burwood site is one of only five drive-in sites to remain at least partly intact (3 are still operating) out of the 60 that once existed in Victoria.

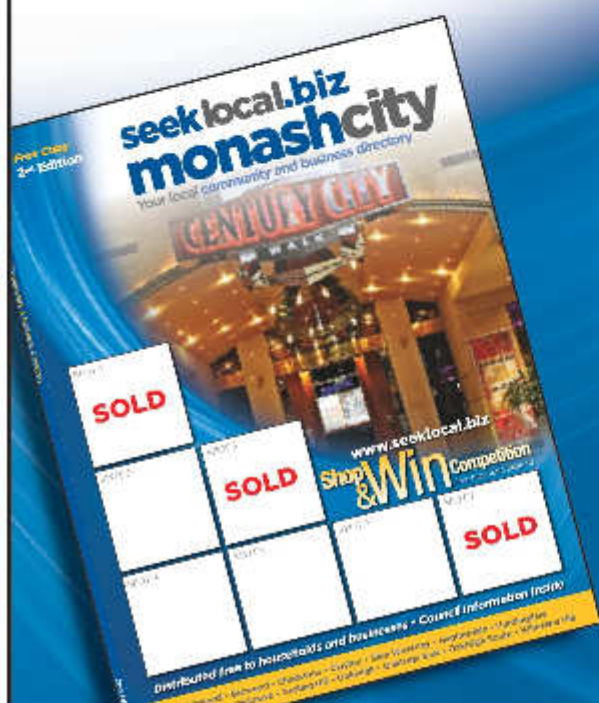

ARROW JOINS THE CAUSE

Steve Nicholls' Seeing Eye Dog 'Arrow' was inducted as a member of the Lions Club of Boroondara Central. He was inducted by Lion, Tony Benbow, in a ceremony held at Club Hawthorn on June 15. The club presented 'Arrow' with a Lions jacket and a 3rd birthday cake.

Steve is a club VP and Membership Chairman, who entertains members with many tales of the hilarious incidents which happen in the course of living life with limited sight and a Seeing Eye Dog. As a young child growing up, it wasn't always easy for Steve

- even though he wore prescription glasses life still seemed to be very difficult. He continually struggled with his schoolwork and felt generally frustrated with life. His parents thought he was just clumsy as he was always bumping into things.

Steve never actually found out that he had an eye disease until he got his car licence. The day he went for his licence they didn't do an eye test and he passed. After having 10 accidents (all side impacts) in one year and having to go to court over them, the judge ruled that Steve must have his eyes tested.

He was only 20 years old when they told him that he did in fact have an eye disease called Retinitis Pigmentosa or RP for short and he had suffered from this disease since birth. RP is tunnel vision and total night blindness. He was told that RP was hereditary and that by the time he was 24 he would be completely blind.

Naturally at the age of 20, Steve was devastated by this news and would not accept the diagnosis. He still wanted and needed to be treated as a sighted person and it took him 16 years to realise that he was in fact going to have to learn to live as a blind person.

At the time, Steve had a wonderful group of friends who were very concerned about him when he started living like a recluse, too afraid to leave the house. Unbeknown to Steve, his friends had contacted Seeing Eye Dogs Australia (SEDA) and booked him in to be allocated a Seeing Eye Dog.

In June of 2000 Steve's life was to be changed forever; he received the greatest gift of all: a male black Labrador x Golden Retriever called 'Zappa'. Steve spent 6 weeks living and training with him at a residence that SEDA provides for their clients. Steve can still remember the first time he went out for a walk with 'Zappa' in harness and the instructor telling him "you can breathe now".

Steve learnt very quickly that having a Seeing Eye Dog was one of the best things he could have ever done. After spending 16 years depending on people to help him around,

he was free. His dog gave him total independence and Steve no longer needed to hold on to someone's arm to get around. He could do his own shopping, go on public transport and even family outings again, he felt great.

For 8 years, 'Zappa' was Steve's eyes and together they were inseparable, as he was with Steve all the time. 'Zappa' was Steve's greatest friend, giving him companionship, mobility, trust and the greatest gift of all, independence. 'Zappa' asked for little in return, and for this Steve is forever grateful.

After 8 years, 'Zappa' retired and is living a luxurious life of doggie retirement. Steve's next dog, 'Sage' was just 4 years old and she was looking after him just like 'Zappa' did. However 'Sage' was not comfortable travelling on trains, Steve's main form of transport. 'Sage' obviously needed to be in a different environment, so SEDA arranged for her to live with a blind man in the country, where she enjoys long country walks, without the worry of city traffic.

After 6 months, SEDA found 'Arrow' for Steve. He is young and only had his 3rd birthday last week. Although 'Arrow' and Steve took time to get to know each other, they have now built a very strong bond. It's a team effort and it's about having respect for each other, said Steve. 'Arrow' is truly amazing and Steve loves him to bits.

'Arrow' gives Steve confidence to walk out his front door each day. 'Arrow' loves to take charge; he is so positive in his work - he loves travelling on public transport trains, trams, and buses and loves going shopping.

Now 'Arrow' has joined the Lions Club of Boroondara Central, Steve and 'Arrow' are enjoying all the Lions activities, including working in the Op Shop and selling Christmas cakes at Binnings in December. You can meet them when they are both manning the counter at the Lions Op Shop, 1350C Torak Rd, Camberwell (Burwood Village, next to Jager's Carpets). Many customers already know Steve and 'Arrow' and love talking to them.

We're also pleased to announce the Lions Club of Boroondara Central will be inducting Steve's partner Kylie Partington and her Seeing Eye Dog 'Lance' into the club on Wednesday September 21. The Lions District Governor Lou Onley will carry out the induction.

In the Winter edition of the *Burwood Bulletin* last year Natalie Filmer wrote an article about the Burwood cemetery, in which she mentioned Abel Hoadley, who was buried there in 1918. Yvonne Fitzmaurice has researched the life of Abel Hoadley and has written an article about Hoadley and his family. With permission from the Whitehorse Historical Society, we are reprinting the article below:

Abel Hoadley was born on 10 September, 1844 at Willingdon, Sussex, in England. He was the only son of a blacksmith, Peter Hoadley, and his wife Elizabeth Anne (nee Wheeler).

In England, Hoadley was apprenticed to a draper and grocer, but his health failed and he was sent by his family to Melbourne in 1865, in the hope that the sunshine would benefit him. Abel grew stronger and became a nurseryman before obtaining land in East Burwood, where he started an orchard. Whether he married before buying his land or afterwards is unclear. By the 1880s he and his wife were established as orchardists.

On 14 November 1868, three years after his arrival and aged 24 years, he married Susannah Ann Barrett at the United Presbyterian Church at Fitzroy. They had fourteen children.

It is reported that Hoadley's road to success began with a storm that completely stripped his trees of fruit which was ready for harvesting. Mrs Hoadley collected the fruit and made jams in the copper under the chestnut tree. Her idea became 'Rising Sun Jams', which was later taken over by the Australian Jam Company. The business grew and by the late 1880s, Hoadley opened a small factory in South Melbourne, trading as 'A. Hoadley & Co.' under the trademark of 'The Rising Sun'. The business expanded rapidly and the five storey premises, 'The Rising Sun Preserving Works', was built in 1895. Jams, jellies, preserved fruits, candied peels, sauces and confectionery were made by a workforce as large as 200. Late in 1901, there were four preserving factories and a large confectionery works near Princes Bridge. Hoadley acquired the old-established firm of Dillon, Burrows & Co. He extended his range to vinegar, cocoa and chocolate. Eight hundred were employed at the height of the season, and in the early 1900s Hoadley was by far the largest Victorian customer of the Colonial Sugar Refining Company. In 1910, the jam business was sold, and in 1913 when Hoadley retired from business, Hoadley's Chocolates Ltd was formed. He was known to have a paternal attitude towards his workforce, for whom he supplied well-equipped dining rooms in the clean and well aired working premises.

As a devout and active Methodist, he supported the establishment of the Central Mission and remained on the board as a treasurer and executive for many years. In 1903 when the Mission decided to extend its rescue of boys by establishing a country home, Hoadley offered his 38-acre East Burwood orchard for £1000, some £500 less than the

market price. It, with an adjoining property, became the nucleus of the Boys' Training Farm at Tally Ho.

Abel Hoadley died of cancer on 12 May 1918 at his home, Bella Vista in Kew, leaving an estate valued at probate of £58,946. He was survived by his wife, four daughters and four sons. All of the sons were involved in the business.

In the 1930s, after the Wall Street crash of 1929, the firm was on the verge of bankruptcy. An imaginative marketing of candy bars, notably the Violet Crumble, named by Mrs Hoadley after her favourite flower, helped re-establish the firm. During the post-war period there were a number of mergers, the last with an English firm in 1972, the company becoming 'Rowntree Hoadley Ltd'.

The Stephanie Alexander Kitchen Garden Program has been introduced to Wattle Park Primary School. Sara Peiris spoke to Julie Jensz and Robyn Gilmour to find out more:

Can you tell our readers about yourself, the program, and the inspiration behind it?

Julie: I am the garden specialist for the Stephanie Alexander Kitchen Garden program. You might know Stephanie; she's a famous chef. I am a professionally qualified horticulturist and I've worked in schools for over three years.

Robyn: I'm the program coordinator and am in charge of the grades that are involved in the gardening. We are also building a communal kitchen in the school so kids can cook their produce and share with each other at the table. *What influenced you to join Wattle Park Primary School as a garden specialist?*

Julie: This is the second Stephanie Alexander garden project I've been involved in. The garden program at Whitehorse Primary School had great results. We are already progressing with the garden here even though the kids haven't started the actual planting yet.

Robyn: This program is mainly about encouraging the kids to try foods they would not normally try. Sometimes they are familiar with frozen or processed and packaged goods but not with fresh ingredients. *What types of plants grow in the kitchen garden? Do you grow vegetables and herbs only or do you also grow fruit? Is it completely organic?*

Julie: Anything we can eat! We have both veggies and fruit growing. We hope to introduce

an apple grove, a kiwifruit trellis tunnel and a berry garden with strawberries and raspberries. It is completely organic and based on permaculture design. We even have chooks.

Robyn: We also want an orchard with plums and cherries. We are putting in plants, which grow all year around. The kitchen garden program is organised so the children can have a gardening lesson first, pick their produce, go to the kitchen and then have a shared cooking lesson. Then they eat the prepared food as a group.

Is the gardening in one area or is it divided into plots for different grades? Which grades are involved? How many kids work at a time?

Julie: We do have a separate area for the garden but it's designed as a shared garden so there aren't any individual plots. One grade is involved at a time. It's grades 3 and 4 that are taking part, 112 students. Each class works in micro-groups of five headed by volunteers from the community. The volunteers don't need to have green thumbs – just enjoy gardening and working with kids.

Robyn: We could always use more volunteers for the program. They will be very welcome.

Into a Primary Concern

What do the kids think? Are they happy to get their hands dirty? Who chooses what to grow?

Julie: Well, we haven't started on that here yet but at previous schools, the feedback was positive. The boys enjoy working with tools and getting their hands dirty. For those that don't like getting their hands dirty, we have gloves! Others enjoy the food preparation and sharing part of it while some enjoy the process of watching their produce grow and develop. They loved the program and always looked forward to it. I am in charge of deciding what we will plant but I ask the kids what they would like to grow.

British chef Jamie Oliver has a program where he serves healthy food at school canteens. Does that happen with your produce?

Robyn: This is about more than having a healthy lunchbox. It's about focusing on fresh food. It's about giving kids the confidence to have a go at preparing meals themselves without being dependent on someone else to make their food.

Julie: If they have never had experience with gardening before, they will never try. When they grow up, as a result of this experience, they won't be afraid to have a veggie patch themselves.

Stephanie Alexander has said she wanted to promote a love of growing and sharing food rather than food charts and pyramids. Do you think that has been successfully achieved here?

Julie: It has been hugely successful before and it would be great to get those results here. The Stephanie Alexander program is broken down into a 4-fold philosophy: growing, harvesting, preparing and sharing. I am involved with the first two. Together, the kids prepare a 3-course meal for lunch once a week. Our food is mostly composed of vegetarian meals.

Robyn: The eating habits we are preparing them for are not typical of the regular house meals. It's providing an education about the culture of food.

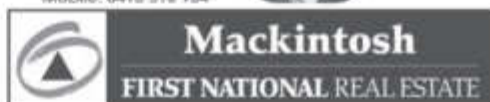

The membership in 1989 stood at 28. Today it has been reduced to only 11 members.

Over the years both financial and practical help has been and is being given to the Canterbury Girl Guides, for the upkeep of their hall. Ashy Redbacks Mark 40 years

The Ashburton United Junior Football Club (aka Ashy Redbacks or AUJFC) celebrates its 40th anniversary this year.

This is quite an achievement especially when you consider the teams and clubs that have folded and are long gone from the area in that time, including Hartwell, Burwood, Through Rd, Ashburton Seniors (known as the Ashy Dragons who used to play up at High Street).

At present the Ashy Redbacks have 22 teams, from the U17's (Colts) down to the U9's (Tackers) with every age group in between. We have a registration of around 500 boys, which is more than a number of state schools, and about 300 families are involved. We believe that it is the second biggest stand-alone junior football club in Australia. The Club also supports 3 Auskick clinics.

Hundreds of boys, girls and their families from the local area and elsewhere have been involved in the club over the past four decades either as players, officials, volunteers and/or supporters.

To help mark this milestone we held a "Back to Ashy" Night on Sunday June 19. The night was a great success with over 400 people in attendance. Luke Ball from the Collingwood Football Club, and his brother Matthew who played for Hawthorn are both past players for the Redbacks and turned up much to the delight of the youngsters in the crowd.

Most importantly we also launched 'Ashy Always', a 50,000-word coffee-table book history of the Ashburton United Junior Football Club.

Many of those who have been part of the Club are mentioned in this book, including boys who went on to play with the VFL and AFL. They include Luke and Matthew Ball, Josh Kennedy, Nick Smith and Paul Cooper. We also have 2 other recent past players already signed up to AFL sides being Tom Mitchell (Sydney) and Jack Viney (Melbourne).

Author Bruce Phillips is a former journalist and club life member, who over the past four years has done a mountain of work compiling the history right back to 1971 and along the way has gathered many interesting anecdotes and stories, one of which involves Kylie Minogue. It is based on club minutes, correspondence, newsletters and the first-hand accounts of more than 70 past and present players and parents.

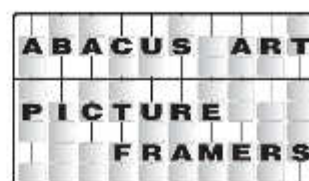

The recipients of our 2011 fundraising will be Heartkids. We plan to assist the parents and children of a local kindergarten to finance a kid's fitness program. This is part of a CWA venture to help "bridge the generations."

Their most recent string of performances is titled *Murder & Mirth: A Season of One Act Plays*. I attended the matinee, catching two of the four one-act plays:

Inside Ashwood College's Performing Arts Centre a group of passionate, local theatre buffs enjoyed the comedy and drama. *Murder & Mirth* was a roller coaster of hilarity and drama.

Opening with a satirical take on pet ownership, love and self-sacrifice titled *Fur Better or Worse*, the star of the show was certainly Felix (played by James Shaw).



His aloof and superior portrayal of a domesticated cat was creepily accurate. Toni (played by Rosie Reyne) showed just

how frustrating looking for love can be, with Robyn (Aynslye Watson) as the potential love interest.

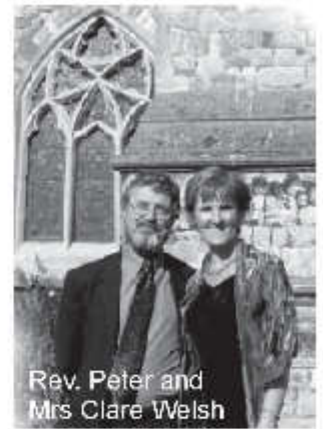

Bardolph Street Hardware

I travelled to Melbourne recently from my home in Point Lonsdale, staying overnight with family in Burwood. Nostalgia suggested I visit old haunts and go via Maverston Street and Bardolph Street in Burwood (or must I now call it Glen Iris?) where we once lived and my parents ran the hardware shop.

Oh dear!

The hardware shop came about in 1953. My family arrived from the UK in 1952. Father had had enough of the Civil Service there and access to university here was easier than the overcrowded UK system, so we grabbed the chance to travel. Being a handyman, Father thought running a hardware shop was appealing and we looked for a suitable empty 'lock-up' shop.

There in Burwood's Bardolph Street we found it. The block of nine shops was built in the 1920's, when the adjacent Summerhill housing estate was being developed. It backed onto the Burwood railway station and had the benefit of good passing trade with commuters.

What was convenience shopping in 1953? At the northern (lower) end of Bardolph St: No. 1. A cake shop run by the two Misses Corless.

No. 5. The butcher's shop of George Lockie. (George was very much the traditional family butcher, often with memorable displays of pigs' heads in the window).

No. 7. A traditional Italian fruit and vegetable shop of the D'Onofrio family (known as Mr Don).

No. 9. The hardware shop of my parents, Fred and Emily Parkinson of which more later.

No. 11. A grocer and delicatessen with a residential flat upstairs.

No. 13. A wool shop and lending library run by Ann Ruddiman, well-remembered for her two beautiful daughters: Sally, a finalist in the Miss Teenage Victoria contest and Carol, a fellow student of mine at R.M.T.C. at that time.

No. 15. Maurie Richardson's pharmacy.

No. 17. (cnr Maverston & Bardolph Sts) The Burwood West Post Office with Milk Bar and newspapers stand. This was run by the two elderly Misses Cox, Liz and Fran, who had a residence at the back of the property and were suspected to be relatives of W. S. Cox of Cox Plate fame.

The 50m square corner block on the other side of Bardolph St was then open grassland with a very much used shortcut path diagonally across it to Maverston St.

The empty shop No. 9 had previously been a studio of photographer Donald Hancock and latterly the acclaimed Melbourne fashion photographer Athol Shmith.

In January 1953, Father and I fitted out the shop with shelving, counters and so forth, the materials coming from Burwood Timbers across the railway line in Trent Street. I recall scorching hot weather and consumption of vast quantities of the cordial '50-50'.

About the same time we purchased a house, 80m away at 13 Maverston St. The family (Fred, Emily, 17-year-old cousin Sheila and I) moved from Box Hill and the set-up was complete.

The hardware shop continued for some sixteen years. Fred opened and closed it on weekdays, Emily looked after the middle of the day and both were on deck Saturday mornings. Saturday afternoons and Sundays were not opening times in those days, although it was common enough for the odd emergency request to have someone 'pop over' from the house at the weekend.

Typical of these shops, the one or two-person staffing enabled personal relationships with customers to become established. If we didn't have it, we'd get it for you. If there was uncertainty, advice was usually available. If it was heavy, we'd deliver it.

My contribution was restricted to these deliveries and I recall tins of paint (the day of 'plastic paints' had dawned),

precast concrete paving slabs, gardening materials, great quantities of Fowler's Vacola bottling outfits and supplementary glassware, lids, seals and clips. It seemed every good wife, worthy of the name, bottled fruit in those days.

Father's death in 1970 saw the end of the hardware shop. However, with building pressure from nearby shopping centres in Hartwell and Ashburton, Bardolph Street shops began to fade.

Today? No shops. The commuters still walk past but no one stops. Some shops are just empty; some are offices, the shop fronts blocked off. Down the road in Hartwell, the Toorak Road shops, which forced this termination, are in turn being supplanted by the vast supermarket.

Is it better today? It is certainly different.

Oh dear!

Thanks for some memory jogging by Sheila's husband, Rob Franklin and his cohorts in the 1st Hartwell Scout group of those days.

Lights! Cameras! Shorts!

This year's Lights! Cameras! Shorts! film festival held by the City of Monash is set to please all cinema buffs and Hollywood 'wannabes'.

The annual film festival encourages creative residents and students from Monash to submit original films in the hope of winning a prize. Village Cinemas Century City Walk will show all applicants films on the big screen at the official October festival on October 19.

Ranging from animation shorts to action-packed trailers, each film is 15 minutes or less. Twelve awards will acknowledge the best and most creative pieces, with a maximum of three awards going to Secondary School applicants. The six categories are:

- Best Film (Open Category)
- Best Film (Secondary School Award)
- Best Lead Actor
- Best Lead Actress
- Best Original Concept (Secondary School Award)
- Audience Choice Award (Judged on the night for both Open Category and Secondary School Award)

The Burwood Bulletin caught up with 2010 Secondary School Best Film winner Mitchell Connolly, to find out what it takes to make a good flick. His take on the Bram Stoker original *Dracula*, was celebrated as a unique and well-produced trailer by event organisers.

The short film was built entirely out of Lego and filmed in stop-motion, a very lengthy and detailed process for any film maker.

"I made it as a VCE media film in 2009 whilst I was in Year 11 at Melbourne High. The film is really a bridging text from the book, an adaptation from the Bram Stoker novel", Mitchell said. Having made stop-motion animation films in the past, Mitchell admits it can be lengthy but says "I am used to the process."

It took about three months of fairly intense work to finish. "After buying the Lego, building everything, and the time you spend moving everything in front of the camera, it took around 50 hours", he said.

Being a passionate young animator, it didn't take much convincing for Mitchell to enter his piece in the festival. "I decided why not, what have you got to lose. This year I have made another film for uni, a short film that I think I might enter also". Rather than hoping to win a prize, Mitchell is looking forward to watching everybody else's work at the final screening. It's really the highlight of the festival for him.

Mitchell's new 90-second film is about a pianist with obsessive-compulsive disorder, which he sees as a little ironic. He is studying film at Swinburne University and hoping to become involved in visual effects and animation, his advice for young film-makers is simple.

"If you're thinking about making a film or if you have a semi decent idea, don't just sit around waiting for inspiration, get out there and make it. Either way at least you would've learnt something or who knows, it might even be amazing."

According to the 'future Tim Burton', the major issue for young filmmakers is second guessing themselves and their ideas. This, Mitchell says, "always leads to nothing. To view Mitchell Connolly's 2010 winning entry *Dracula*, visit www.youtube.com/watch?v=JT3OubboZLw
